Waynedale Earns a Superior Rating at One Act Play Competition:

The 2017 Wayne County One Act Play Festival was held at Northwestern High School on Tuesday, January 24th. Waynedale participated with the play, "How To Kiss a Girl." Waynedale earned a Superior, the highest possible rating. Senior Brady Troyer received the honor of All County Cast for his role as Ken. Cast members were: Talon Brooks, Rory Chabak, Brady Troyer, Kristina Currans, Emma Zuercher, Sarah Harter, Debra Wellman, Tasha Yoder, Sarah Maynard, Ben Wilkinson, Noah Suttle, Savannah Fisher, Jacob Moore, and Covie Gray. Junior Raquel Miller won \$150 third prize in an essay contest sponsored by the Wooster NAACP for her essay about Dr. Martin Luther King Jr, the history of African-Americans, and how that history connected to the Civil Rights Movement. On MLK day, Raquel attended an awards ceremony and dinner by the NAACP at Wooster's First Presbyterian Church. She wrote her essay in her Waynedale College Credit Plus composition class.

Last fall, Waynedale members of an after-school writing club called the Inklings entered their fiction in the Scholastic Art & Writing Awards, a national contest for young writers and artists. At the Midwest regional level, these students won: Lizzie Schrock, sophomore, gold medal for "A King's Throne", Maizie Frantz, junior, honorable mention for "Light", Hailey Schlegel, senior, 1) silver medal for "Look through the Tunnel; 2) honorable mention for "On the Other Side of the Tracks"; and 3) honorable mention for her portfolio "Expression of Creativity" containing eight pieces, Sadie Schlegel, senior, 1) silver medal for "To Paint the Sky"; 2) honorable mention for "One More Polaroid"; 3) and honorable mention for her portfolio "To the End" containing eight pieces.

The contest receives approximately 10,000 works of art and writing. Regional gold medals are awarded to the top 5-7%, silver medals to the top 7-10%, and honorable mention goes to the top 10-15%. As a gold medalist, Lizzie's short story goes on to compete at the national level.

STARK STATE BUSINESS COLLEGE

Waynedale High School (in conjunction with Orrville, Rittman, Smithville, and Wayne County Schools Career Center) continues to offer Business Administration/Entrepreneurship courses through Stark State College. This is the 2nd year the program and classes have been offered. The classes use identical long-distance learning labs in each of the five schools, with instructors, Mrs. Kelly J. Miller and Mrs. Julie Keener, who will rotate between all five classrooms every week, but will be visible and present virtually to all the students in the classes. This opportunity is thanks to a Straight A grant from the state of Ohio and is part of the Young Entrepreneurs' Consortium. Students are able to earn high school and college credit as the classes are part of the College Credit Plus (CCP) program provided through the state. As with all CCP classes, these classes are offered free of charge to students.

Students will acquire a broad understanding of all areas business, including opportunity recognition and evaluation, and new venture startup and growth. They will also learn leadership, motivation, communication, team-building, goal setting, planning, organizational and decision-making skills. Classes that are offered include:

Entrepreneurship, Business Law and Ethics, Business Administration, Principles of Marketing, Global Entrepreneurship, Business Analysis with Algebra, Human Resource Management, Managing Entrepreneurial Growth, Principles of Management, Financial Accounting, Microeconomics, Macroeconomics

These classes are offered starting sophomore year. If a student follows the pathway for this program and completes all of the classes offered, they could be only four classes shy of an associate degree in Business Administration/Entrepreneurship from Stark State College when they leave high school! This program is also beneficial for a student who wants to investigate the business world more before heading off to college or work to gain knowledge and experience. Any interested student should see the school counselor, Jenn Troyer, prior to April 1st to complete the required CCP paperwork.
